To those of you that have volunteered to help maintain the gardens at the American Legion, THANK YOU. Here's a few tips that may be useful to speed up your time there and make the project as easy as possible.

- ☐ STAY HYDRATED- Plan refreshments
- ☐ HAT – Wear one
- ☐ GO EARLY- Early morning hours tend to be the best time. Avoid hot sun and rain showers.
- ☐ CONSIDER A KNEE PAD - The Blue Star Memorial plants are at ground level. A knee pad or a short garden stool might be helpful.
- ☐ TAKE GLOVES – Save your hands and professional manicures.
- ☐ TRASH BAG – Take small trash bag for pulled weeds and clippings. Haul off.
- ☐ CLIPPERS – Small handheld clippers may be helpful. At times the plants benefit from clippings.
- ☐ WEED KILLER – The club owns a jug of weed killer. Please report to the chair if the gardens need care other than general weed pulling.
- ☐ DAY OF SERVICE –Please consult with your weed whacker partner to schedule a day to meet at the American Legion or if desired plan two separate days. Kindly let the chair know what day of the month you have serviced the gardens.
