The content varies month to month, depending on current activities of the club.

Funding for the "News You Can Use" is primarily In-Kind. Personal computers, programs, and printers are used to create the .PDF and e-book files. The hard copy files sent to non-email members require postage, paid for by the LPGC.

4. Continuing involvement, follow-up, or maintenance;

Newsletter editors, aka Wordsmiths, and their duties are:

Wendy Parent – Duties include games, puzzles, member profiles, proofing Sue Rood – Duties include article submissions, addition of archived club files, proofing Doris Rohner – Duties include initial drafts, pdf & e-book creation, distribution

The Wordsmiths work together via email, phone, and text on a monthly basis to share ideas and keep on track for publication release. Each issue is released mid-month for the current and following months coverage. It never fails. Members support the efforts of the Wordsmiths with positive comments, verbal and electronically.

The following months are submitted in hard copy per submission requirements, as well as links to the ebook versions. September (ebook HERE) October (ebook HERE) November (ebook HERE) Each newsletter reaches 104 members + additional copies reach new members as they join. A few links in the Sept. and Oct. issues no longer are active due to being removed from the website since the publications. The Wordsmiths planned early in 2025 to publish the first newsletter (June issue) in May 2025, directly after the election of the new board of directors. The club is scheduled to publish 7 newsletters in 2025. To date 6 issues have been published.




