The Blue Star Memorial Garden project, led by Mark Ponsler and Donna Ferchen, is a heartfelt and collaborative initiative dedicated to honoring the brave men and women who have served in the United States Armed Forces. Through their leadership, the garden has become a living tribute that blends natural beauty with patriotic significance. Thoughtfully designed and carefully maintained, it embodies deep respect and gratitude for those who have sacrificed for our nation, providing a peaceful and inspiring space for reflection and remembrance.
