#### 1. A brief summary and objectives of the project;

Garden Therapy is a monthly activity designed for senior residents at the Lake Placid Health and Rehabilitation Center. The Center provides short-term rehabilitation and long-term skilled nursing care in a calm and relaxing atmosphere. During each session, residents learn how to create their own floral arrangements using live plant and flower clippings. This hands-on experience promotes relaxation, creativity, and joy, while encouraging connection with nature. At the end of each session, residents get to keep their beautiful arrangements to brighten their rooms and enhance their personal well-being.

#### 2. Description of the involvement of other club members, other organizations, etc.;

Other club members actively contribute to the success of our Garden Therapy program in many ways. Members bring their own flowers and greens, while several purchase additional blooms and supplies. Some have donated containers, bows, and holiday cards to enhance the residents' arrangements. We even have a dedicated member who, though unable to attend sessions, reliably purchases beautiful bouquets—often roses—from Publix for the residents to include in their creations. In addition, some members make monetary donations to support the program. Our club also provides supplies such as paper, wet foam, snacks, and small gifts. We always serve cookies or crackers on special plates and napkins, while the facility graciously provides juice.

#### 3. Project expenses and means of funding;

The supplies for Garden Therapy are primarily donated. Members generously provide greenery and flowers from their personal gardens, and containers and floral materials are also contributed. On occasion, when additional supplies are needed, they are purchased by club members and reimbursed by the club if requested.

#### 4. Continuing involvement, follow-up, or maintenance;

Those of us who participate regularly have developed warm friendships with many of the residents who attend each month. We celebrate holidays together and prepare for each session with care—creating handmade placemats, colorful picks, and decorated containers filled with wet foam ready for arranging. We often bring small gifts such as cards, necklaces, and stuffed animals, and sometimes even share songs (which the residents love, despite our less-than-perfect voices!). Our continued involvement has made Garden Therapy a joyful, familiar tradition for both members and residents alike. Interestingly, many of the residents were gardeners themselves, which deepens their enjoyment. One memorable moment came when a resident from Jamaica, a former chef, declined to use rosemary in his arrangement because its fragrance made him hungry!
